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## Double-Layer No-Sew Throws

### WHAT YOU NEED

Approximately 3 yds. polar fleece or cotton fleece (1½ yds. in one color, 1½ yds. in a second color. Fleece is usually 50-60" wide, and you will cut the length to match the width.), ruler, scissors or rotary cutter and cutting mat, acrylic yarn (optional)

### MAKE IT

1. To begin, trim off selvage edges. If the fabrics came in different widths, cut off excess so they are identical-size squares. Make clean, even, and straight cuts with no frayed edges.
2. Layer both fabrics on top of each other and smooth with your hands, pinning the undersides together.
3. Cut a 4" square from each corner of the pinned double layers of fleece.
4. Cut 4" x 1" wide fringe around blanket.
5. Tie each fringe-front to each fringe-back. Make sure the knots are secure.

For yarn-tassel treatment, follow steps 1 and 2. Cut small slits at even intervals a few inches up from the blanket's edge (go through both layers of fabric). Thread a bundle of 4" yarn strands through the slit,



Cut a 4" piece of fabric to use as your corner template. It won't slip like paper will, making cutting easier. Using your ruler and rotary cutter, cut vertically and horizontally almost to the corner but not quite. Then use your scissors to finish the corner cut on each layer. This will give you a clean cut and you won't cut into the neighboring fringe.
